



PROGRAM OVERVIEW



Cascade in the Shade Play Fountain

Thanks to the success of a collaborative project in 2019 to bring colorful, interactive murals to downtown Mount Clemens, a local coalition decided to concentrate efforts on another project that would promote family-friendly fun and inspire creativity. The focus was on a large underutilized green space in the city's Shadyside Park. The unique location of the park would provide access to an exciting and safe play feature for youth and caregivers in a diverse community.



Thanks to the generosity of over a hundred donors including an initial grant from Kaboom! and the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation, a matching grant from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, the George Family, and First State Bank, we raised \$200,000 for a 1400 sq. ft. interactive play fountain with an artistic mural that inspires creativity all year round. The project will be completed by the summer of 2022.



Shadyside Community Art Sessions

Advancing Macomb hosted a series of community art sessions in Mount Clemens' Shadyside Park to inspire community creativity. Supported by the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs grant program, the art sessions helped bring arts and crafts to the citizens of Mount Clemens. Local residents came together to create and to talk about ways to enhance their community through art.

Each session featured local artists who brought samples of their work and shared their process, creativity, and skills. Attendees had a chance to paint, draw, construct, arrange, imagine, and put their own spin on their work. During the sessions, attendees also provided ideas for design themes for the mural that will accompany the upcoming park play fountain.




Adaptive Leadership Circle

Advancing Macomb partnered with EmcArts, a national service organization that works alongside individuals, organizations, and communities as they tackle their most complex challenges. EmcArts offers a six-month peer cohort, the Adaptive Leadership Circle (ALC), which uses a collaborative approach to improve organizational resiliency in the face of COVID-19's constant disruptive change.

The goals of the ALC included identifying and exploring an individual leadership challenge, developing and implementing a small experiment toward this goal, and building this collaborative cohort into a group for shared learning and mutual support. With assistance from the Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan, Advancing Macomb was able to provide the program at no cost to the cohort.

Community Innovation Workshops



In conjunction with the Adaptive Leadership Circle, Advancing Macomb also partnered with EmcArts on a program working in complex community change in Macomb County.

The Community Innovation Workshops (CIW) were a ten-session series focusing building adaptive capacity for change and innovation dealing with the complex challenges faced by our nonprofit organizations and community in Macomb County. The collaborative learning workshops helped bring an experimental mindset to learning to create new and adaptive responses, rather than technical fixes.

Participants learned a wide range of practical tools and techniques to expand their capacity and perspectives on complex change which they can take with them to use in their own organizations and communities.

Michigan Community Resilience Program

Advancing Macomb was selected to be one of 13 organizations in the state to partner with the Michigan Community Service Commission (MCSC) to launch the Michigan Community Resilience Program. This program focuses on making an impact during the COVID-19 response and recovery by expanding volunteerism and increasing the efficiency, effectiveness, and geographic reach of organizations throughout the state.

The MCSC partnership has allowed Advancing Macomb to highlight local volunteers through the MI Heroes Project, share professional development opportunities to area nonprofits, and was the impetus for the beginning of a Macomb County Long-Term Recovery Group (LTRG) to facilitate community recovery from the impact of disaster in our region.
